1. PURPOSE OF THE RFQ

The purpose of this RFQ is to appoint suitably qualified service providers for the supply, delivery, technical support, installation assistance of prepaid electricity meters for municipal operations within Williston and Fraserburg.

The Municipality reserves the right to:

- Appoint one or more service providers;
- Award the quotation in whole or in part;
- Procure supply items separately from installation and maintenance services;
- Request clarification or additional information from bidders.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

The successful bidder shall provide the following:

- Supply and delivery of ninety (90) prepaid electricity meters consisting of:
 - Forty-eight (48) single-phase meters; and
 - Forty-two (42) three-phase meters.

Technical Support and Installation Assistance

- Provide installation assistance, commissioning, testing and technical support as and when requested by the Municipality;
- Integration with the Municipality's existing vending/token system (SGC);
- Supply all required accessories, terminals, connectors and related materials where applicable.

Important Note

The Municipality may undertake portions of the installation work internally. The appointed supplier will therefore only be required to provide installation assistance, commissioning, technical support services on an as-needed basis and upon request by the Municipality.

4. INSTALLATION ASSISTANCE AND TECHNICAL SUPPORT

- Provide technical assistance for installation and commissioning when requested by the Municipality;
- Provide fault-finding and troubleshooting support;
- Assist with integration to the Municipality's existing SGC vending/token system;
- Conduct testing and verification of supplied equipment and all systems;
- Provide installation assistance, maintenance, repairs and related services.

5. TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

Training shall be provided where required and must include:

- Meter operation and management;
- Fault finding and troubleshooting;

6. WARRANTY AND AFTER-SALES SUPPORT

- Minimum warranty period: twelve (12) months per unit;
- Bidders must provide details of after-sales support;
- Warranty exclusions and response times must be clearly stated.

7. DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS

- Delivery shall be to designated municipal sites in Williston and Fraserburg;
- Bidders must provide estimated lead times;
- All equipment must be delivered in new condition and suitable for immediate use.

8. CIDB GRADING REQUIREMENT

The minimum CIDB grading required is:

CIDB 2EP or higher

(Electrical Engineering Works – Specialised Works: Electrical Installations)

The Municipality reserves the right to consider higher gradings where required by project scope or municipal thresholds.

This preference form must form part of all tenders invited. It contains general information and serves as a claim form for preference points for specific goals.

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to invitations to tender:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
- the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

1.2 Either the **90/10 or 80/20 preference point system** will be applicable in this tender. The lowest/ highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the accurate system once tenders are received.

1.3 Points for this tender (even in the case of a tender for income-generating contracts) shall be awarded for:

- (a) Price; and
- (b) Specific Goals

1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) **“tender”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) **“price”** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the

- time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) **“tender for income-generating contracts”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) **“the Act”** means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

3. FORMULAE FOR PROCUREMENT OF GOODS AND SERVICES

3.1 POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

3.1.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

3.2.1 POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1 In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2 In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of-

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
